
Comprehensive Primary Care and Access to Ancillary, Inpatient, and Specialty Services

You must provide documentation that your site offers culturally competent comprehensive care through referral arrangements for ancillary, inpatient, and specialty care that are not available onsite.

Documents that meet the requirements include signed Memorandums of Understanding, signed Memorandums of Agreement or signed contracts with ancillary, inpatient, and specialty facilities. If formal referral arrangements do not exist, you must provide a dated and signed description of how it ensures patient access to ancillary, inpatient, and specialty care.

To meet this requirement, add the signed and dated letter to the 'Upload Documents' section of the application.

Client Referral and Follow-up Policy and Procedure

The Mental Health Program refers clients to appropriate specialty services at assessment and throughout the course of treatment. Referrals to services include, but are not limited to: Primary Care Providers, Psychiatric Prescribers, Substance Use Disorder Treatment, Detoxification Services, Medication for substance use disorder services, Prenatal Care Providers, and Behavioral Health Hospitalization Services. We assist clients with locating service providers and provide support and assistance with establishing care in a variety of ways including, but not limited to: contacting providers to gather more information about services offered, assisting clients with initial phone calls to set-up services, advocating for clients to receive needed services, and conducting warm-handoffs with new providers. We encourage clients to sign Authorization to Release Information for new providers. The Authorization to Release Information is sent via fax and then we follow-up with a phone call to establish a working relationship with the new provider for collaboration and care coordination.
