- Professional opportunities for post-secondary students to work with teams of professionals across DOH on a variety of public health topics and issues.
- Internships may involve a range of projects and shadowing opportunities with internal and external public health partners;
- Internship projects may vary depending upon the student's degree level as well as area(s) of interest and skill sets.

Key Details

- 10-week summer internship (mid-June to mid-August 2025)
- Average 35 hours/week
- Hourly wage at roughly \$20 per hour
- Positions are primarily remote (students may live anywhere in Washington State)
- Students must be actively enrolled and pursuing a post-secondary degree (at the associates' level to the undergraduate or graduate level)

- Exposure to professional work environments in public health
- Opportunity to develop and apply skills in your field(s) of interest
- Networking opportunities with public health professionals

February 3, 2025
Internship position announcement posted on [GovJobs](https://www.govjobs.us).

February 14, 2025
Application deadline for internship applicants.

March 2025
Applicants selected for interviews proceed through interview process.

April 2025
Selected candidates offered summer internship placement in divisions across the agency.

Mid-June to mid-August 2025
10-week, paid summer internship (averaging 35 hours/week).

What you need to know

- Submit application by deadline.
- Interns must be pursuing a post-secondary degree (at the associate's, undergraduate, or graduate degree level)
- Application must include resume, cover letter, and references.
- Internship includes professional development and project-based learning experiences.
