 - o This project highlights how people can get involved in the rule making process.
 - The video has already been translated to other language such as Spanish, Marshallese, and Vietnamese.

• (37:00) Start of Jazmin's presentation

- o Jazmin provided a brief overview of the Interim Language Access Plan.
- A new access plan is in the beginning stages with the goal to have it available for usage by the end of 2025.
- The goal of reviewing this interim plan is to find out what is currently working and/or what is missing to include in the new plan that is being developed.

• (39:13) Discussion/questions include:

- The difficulty of being able to engage with government due to needing certain levels of accessibility, including accommodations and language interpretation, that are not readily available.
- Discussion about definitions of words included in the interim plan and how it can be more inclusive of lived experiences. Example: shared histories of war, tribes, deaf people, etc.
- The possibility of having multiple modalities of the plan available.
- Proposal to provide a simple statement of the plan's intention. Suggestion: this
 language access plan is intended to make sure that the Department of Health services
 are accessible to everyone regardless of the language they speak, the culture they come
 from, etc.
- (47:22) discussion about back up interpreters for major news updates, child and parent dynamics regarding interpreting, if there is a need for multiple interpreters for example from one spoken language to a different signed language.
- (50:52) discussion about some languages, for example from West Africa, where there are 16 countries with hundreds of languages, and they are spoken languages, not written languages. This makes access to information and services difficult.
- The need for interpreters being provided/available is highlighted and emphasized.
