

Adolescent Well-Visits

What you need to know



If you're 11-21, you need a yearly Adolescent Well-Visit!

An adolescent well-visit is a yearly visit with your primary care provider (doctor, nurse, physician's assistant) to check your growth, development, and overall wellbeing.

- It's also called a well-child check, annual physical, or annual doctor appointment.
- It's free with most health insurance plans, including AppleHealth.
- It's different than a sports physical, but it can count as one!



Your primary care provider will:

- **Do a physical exam** to check your blood pressure, ears, eyes, throat, heart, lungs, and belly.
- Ask about **mental health**, life at home and school, eating and sleeping habits, and screen use.
- Give you **private time to talk** about sensitive topics like relationships, alcohol or drug use, or sexual activity. **If your provider forgets to offer, it's OK to ask.**
- **Give any vaccines** based on your age or grade.
- Answer your questions about your health or body and give advice to stay healthy.

Know Your Rights

In Washington, you can get some health care on your own, even if you're under 18:

- Any age: Emergency care, birth control, pregnancy care, and abortion
- Age 13 and over: Mental health and substance use care and treatment
- Age 14 and over: Sexually transmitted infection (STI) testing and treatment

You can also keep this care private. Ask your provider how confidentiality works.
