## School-Based Health Center (SBHC) Report

The Washington State Department of Health manages the School-Based Health Center (SBHC) grant program. The program was established in 2021 through RCW 43.70.825. The grant program expands and sustains the availability of SBHCs for K-12 students in Washington public schools by awarding grants for planning, start-up, operations, and behavioral health improvement. The grant awards prioritize reaching communities that are historically underserved.

### SBHC grant funding supported **16** schools or clinical organizations:

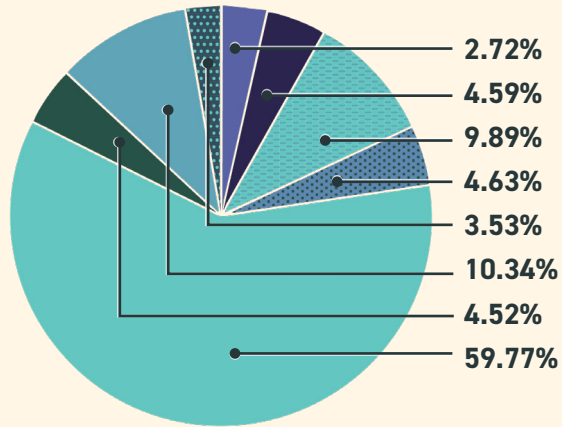

- 30 Total SBHC and Project Sites









### SBHC grantees provided **more than 17,000** visits

- 8,387 Risk and Behavioral Health Screenings

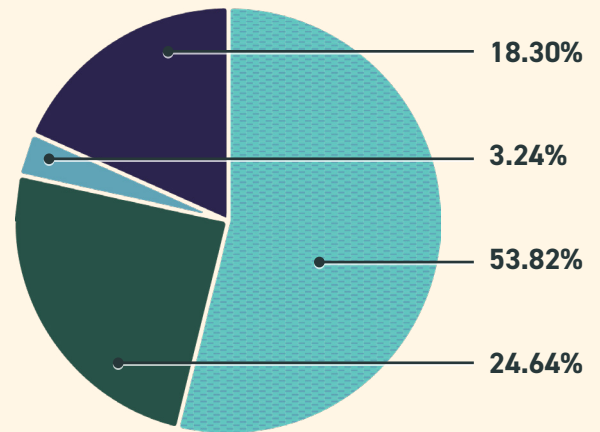
