The Environmental Justice Council

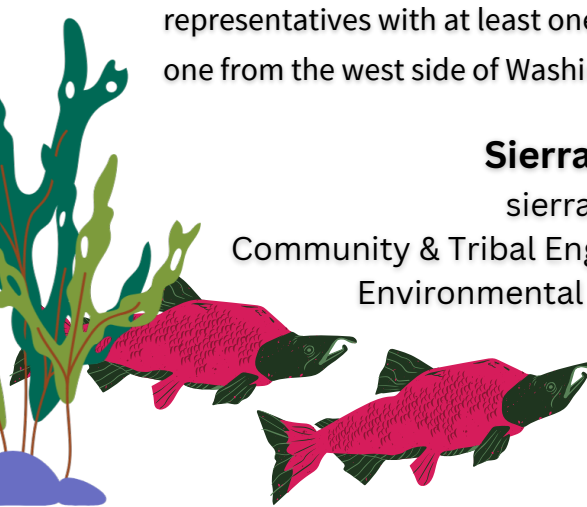
- serves as a forum for frontline Tribes and communities

The Council is a governor-appointed body that holds many diverse perspectives including four tribal representatives with at least one from the east, and one from the west side of Washington.
